Continue to foster a diverse and meaningful continuum of community service opportunities.



2 Community Service Opportunity Fairs, featuring 102 community benefit organizations, garnering 8,652 contacts between students and agencies.



21 Scholars in Service students served 2,151 hours with 11 organizations.



100 students provided **300** hours of service to **7** community organizations during the annual Bud Richter week of service



1,562 children mentored, tutored, and supported by **182** Jumpstart, ENP Reads, and AIMS members in collaboration with **24** community partners.



25 Richter Center Student Leaders planned 22 events and provided 2,608 hours of volunteer work, which generated 3,922 hours of service to the community.



234 students earned \$1,707,641 to support their education through scholarships and work-study by providing 883,634 hours of service to the community.

OTHER NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS



Alternative Spring Break: 31 students serving at **3** community sites provided **554** hours of service.



Blood Drives: Hosted **4** campus drives which brought in **2,035** blood donors, potentially impacting up to **6,100** lives in the Central Valley.



Central Valley College Corps: 87 Fellows provided a total of 37,440 hours of service. Fellows mentored and tutored 1,588 students, planted over 1,300 trees and other native plants, and distributed over 611,853 pounds of food to those experiencing food insecurity.
