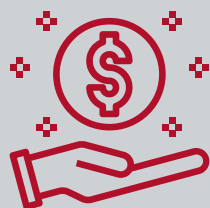

GOAL

Pursue outreach, faculty development and support that will lead to an increase in the quality and quantity of service-learning courses at Fresno State.

16 Faculty engaged in training and professional development.

198 Service-learning classes offered.

4,220 Students enrolled in service-learning courses.



121,317 service-learning hours provided to the community.



1 new S-designated course; **8** courses recertified for S-designation.

GOAL

Continue to foster a diverse and meaningful continuum of community service opportunities.



2 Community Service Opportunity Fairs, featuring **98** community benefit organizations, garnering **8,355** contacts between students and agencies.



21 Scholars in Service students served **2,044** hours with **11** organizations.



2 student showcases where **346** students presented **72** posters highlighting their service experiences.



1,136 children mentored, tutored, and supported by **139** Jumpstart, ENP Reads, and AIMS members in collaboration with **29** community partners.



24 Richter Center Student Leaders planned **21** events and provided **2,092** hours of volunteer work, which generated **3,816** hours of service to the community.



262 students earned **\$1,648,484** to support their education through scholarships and work-study by providing **88,474** hours of service to the community.

OTHER NOTABLE ACHIEVEMENTS



Alternative Spring Break: **52** students serving at **3** community sites provided **1,040** hours of service.



Central Valley College Corps: **107** Fellows provided a total of **44,917** hours of service. Fellows mentored and tutored **2,371** students, planted over **1,500** trees and other native plants, and distributed over **2,562,000** pounds of food to those experiencing food insecurity.



Blood Drives: Hosted **4** campus drives which brought in **1,330** blood donors, potentially impacting up to **4,000** lives in the Central Valley.
