Alternative Spring Break: 52 students serving at 3 community sites provided 1,040 hours of service.



**Blood Drives:** Hosted **4** campus drives which brought in **1,330** blood donors, potentially impacting up to **4,000** lives in the Central Valley.



**Central Valley College Corps: 107** Fellows provided a total of **44,917** hours of service. Fellows mentored and tutored **2,371** students, planted over **1,500** trees and other native plants, and distributed over **2,562,000** pounds of food to those experiencing food insecurity.



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
