- a. The committee reviewed ARTH 141. Areas with room for improvement for this syllabus were discussed. First, with regard to course goal #4, "Prepare students to function in an international multicultural world," the course assignments could be tied into this goal more specifically and intentionally. And while the project for these courses appear to be a rigorous and meaningful assignment, it is the only assignment other than two midterm exams and a final exam. A motion was made and seconded indicating that the committee will approve this syllabus along with the committee asking the chair to forward the above recommendation for consideration of the author. The motion was carried in a unanimous vote.
- b. The committee reviewed ARTH 142. As this course structure is a mirror image of ARTH 141, the same issues hold true for this course as well. This course was approved by the committee with the same considerations.
- c. The committee discussed MUS 161B. It is clear the author did not have the criteria for evaluating M/I courses when designing the syllabus. The chair has reached out twice in the last two weeks to the two names that are associated with this syllabus. Hopefully, the changes can be made to the syllabus in time for our next meeting on April 16th.
