Undergraduate Curriculum Committee update:

• Uncertainty of role of committee due to possible revision of APM 206. This committee and UCC don't have clear guidance on how to move ahead with incoming courses; they either continue on with QLT or we just process them out of OnBase

- Possibility of enhanced policy role for committee about how Online/Blended education is managed at Fresno State
- Requirement for online instruction is that faculty member must be approved through training by IDEAS or equivalent training and have blessing from department
- Review is voluntary unless they want to offer course CSU wide
- Post Covid Task Force will go to individual colleges to discuss APM 206
- We are still actively doing voluntary reviews and reviews for CSU wide
- We will be drafting / revising our charge but waiting from updates regarding APM 206

Post Covid Task Force

- K. Tarrant who is on this task force; there are a number of faculty on this task force who are fundamentally against online education
- Attempting to make recommendations/proposals regarding online education including # of courses, office hours, etc.
- If online education is something you value, talk to your senator about what makes good online education
- Resistance to having course reviews
- Online courses not as good a value for students or not as good as a physical in-person class, but this is not based on evidence from the research
- Online courses are seen as second-class by some; decision should be made by individual department
- Argument has been why rigorous review for online courses and not in-person courses
